5 sections (**55 questions**), completed in a fixed order: Quantitative Reasoning, Verbal Reasoning, Analytical Writing (**1 writing task**).

1 hour, 58 minutes

1.6 minutes per question on average.

Official scores can be accessed online **10–15 days after** your test date.

Basic score report.

Select up to **4** programs before your test to receive your scores at no charge. Additional score reports are available for a fee.

Score Validity: Scores are **valid for 5 years**.

Appointments available up to **7 days a week** at a test center or around the clock for exams delivered online. Can be scheduled up to 6 months in advance.

Sections can be completed **in any order** of your choosing.

Appointments available up to **7 days a week** at a test center or around the clock for exams delivered online.

Sections must be completed in a **fixed order**.

Exam Attempts: 5 attempts permitted in a rolling 12-month period; no lifetime limit.

A limit of **16** days between each exam attempt.

Unlimited question bookmark and review, and edit answers for up to three questions per section.

Testers may choose to take their **optional 10-minute break** after the first or second section, and additionally may ask to be temporarily dismissed for any unscheduled breaks like using the restroom.

A limit of **21** days between each exam attempt.

Unlimited ability to skip questions and edit answers per section.

Testers may ask to be temporarily dismissed for any unscheduled breaks like using the restroom, but there are **no scheduled breaks** in the exam structure.

Accommodations: Additional testing time, breaks, and access to other resources.
